



Some brush pickup reminders from the Highway Department:

- Brush pick up will be starting as soon as the weather allows for it. The schedule for brush pick up can be found on the Town's website.
 - Be sure to have separate piles for different types of debris such as having branches by themselves.
 - The Highway Department will **NOT** pick up any type of furniture.
 - Be sure to remove all nails from the wood to help avoid injuries.
 - Please do not put things in barrels or bags, they will **NOT** be picked up.
 - Brush services will be provided until leaf collection begins in the fall.

In addition to picking up brush, your Highway Department has a lot of projects planned this year to improve the Town:

- Bambi Lane Rear Drainage Swale We're extending the rear yard swale from the southwest corner of the subdivision north about 4 or 5 lots. Easements in have been in place for a while, but the weather/work schedule just hasn't worked out to get it done. (Timeframe: August September)
 - Pearwood Drainage Improvement We're installing some draining improvements on the east side of Pearwood to eliminate some roadway and sidewalk flooding. (Timeframe: May June)
 - Kentucky Ave/Lions Park Parking Lot Rehabilitation We're replacing the parking lot at Lions Park, & widening the road slightly to improve pedestrian access to the park & drainage. (Timeframe: June July)
- Elmford Rd Culvert Replacement We're replacing the triple–barrel culvert on Elmford Rd just south of Citrus Dr. This will involve a closure of that part of the road for about 2–3 weeks. (Timeframe: April May)
- Minor Road Repair We're going to make formal repairs of problem sections of roads, especially in those areas where we'll be chip sealing. (Timeframe: May June)
- Major Road Repair We're finalizing our list of roads to mill and replace. The first one on our list? Trabold Rd from Buffalo Rd to the railroad tracks. We'll do about 2-3 miles of roads this year, depending on asphalt costs. (Timeframe: late June mid July)
- Chip Sealing We're finalizing our list of roads to chip seal. In the previous 3 years of our program, we instantly improved almost 30 miles of our streets. We'll be looking to do another 10 or so miles this year in the southeast quadrant of Town. We will send letters out to impacted residents by Memorial Day.

 (Timeframe: late July early August)
- Concrete Work Last year we really improved our in house ability to replace sidewalks, gutters, and catch basins. We got a lot completed, but there is still plenty to do. Look for us in your neighborhood soon!

 (Timeframe: April October)
- First Responders Park Pavilion We're helping out by constructing the concrete slab the pavilion will sit on. (Timeframe: April)

FRIENDLY REMINDERS FROM THE BUILDING DEPARTMENT:



- Be sure to double check whether a permit is needed before starting any projects this season.
- If you are thinking of getting your driveway re-done, please remember you would need to obtain a permit for this. It is called our Right of Way permit.
- As of February 2023, there is a new Town code which requires all residential rental properties to obtain a rental permit. This new Town code is Chapter 148.

 More information can be found on our website or by calling the office.

Welcome to the Town of Gates Assessor's Office. Your Assessor is Agostino Mineo (Augie). His assistants are Dawn Becker and Carol Stone (Froggy).

Each year the Town of Gates Assessment Office prepares and publishes an assessment roll used to determine each individual property owner(s) portion of the tax levy for the school tax bill and the combined Town & County tax bill.

<u>Tax rates are set by each taxing entity independently of each other, like County,</u> Town, Schools, Fire District, Ambulance etc.

The function of the Assessment Office is only to establish the value of your property.

- **May 1** Tentative assessment roll published, by law the Assessor may no longer make changes to assessments; only changes allowed are through the Board of Assessment Review.
- Fourth Tuesday in May Board of Assessment Review (BAR) meets to hear complaint (grievances) on assessments. Last day to file a formal complaint; applications due by 8:00pm on grievance Day.
- **July 1** Final assessment roll published. Forthcoming school and next Town & County tax bills will use data from this roll to do calculation of taxes owed.

Both the tentative and final assessment rolls are published and placed on the Town webpage (required by law), and are also available in the Assessment Department during business hours.

The Assessor's Office is also responsible for administering any exemption(s), where eligibility is met. We offer Limited Income Senior, Limited Income Disability, Veterans, Enhanced STAR, and Volunteer Fire/Ambulance Workers exemptions. These applications are available in our office and on the Town website. It is important to note that all exemptions must be received by March 1st-with no exceptions.

New from Gates PD

Recently, we created a new avenue for residents to share information with the police department, yes you can remain anonymous. Tips@townofgates.org goes directly to our Criminal Investigation Division. In helping see something, say something, residents can now send us information on incidents throughout town. Further the Gates Police work hand and hand with the Monroe County Crime Analysis Center, Monroe County Crime Stoppers and the Monroe County Law Enforcement Council. Tips and info for cases outside of the Town will be forwarded accordingly.

We recently purchased and put into our patrol fleet a Dodge Charger. Most auto makers have moved away from Police equipped sedans and into the SUV market. The Dodge Charger allows us to be fiscally responsible while providing a vehicle adequate for police patrol needs. We have ordered (2) more Chargers for 2023 and will be out and about soon!







Gates Special Police

The Gates Special Police recently graduated 2 new volunteers from the Monroe County Public Safety training facility. This summer you will see officers Jermaine Marks and Jay Fridley at a lot of public events. Both gentleman passed the 3 month peace officer academy after completing a background investigation with our department.

The Special Police Unit assists the Gates Police with traffic direction, animal control, code enforcement duties and parking enforcement. Our Special police unit currently has (1) Special Police Sergeant and (5) Special Police Officers. The Special Police unit is further

overseen by Gates Police Officer Rebecca Leonard and falls under the Gates Police patrol Division, supervised by Lieutenant Matthew Pascarella.

DO YOU HAVE WORKING SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE ALARMS IN YOUR HOME?

Did you know, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms should be replaced every 7-10 years?

The Gates Fire District and the Gates-Chili Fire Department want to keep our community safe. If you are in need of a smoke or CO alarm, please contact us at (585) 426-2720; and we will provide and install smoke and CO alarms in your home free of charge. That's right! They will be provided to you free of charge! We also provide ADA compliant photoelectric strobe smoke alarms and bed shaker alarms for the hearing impaired.



How to Prevent Fires

If you smoke, smoke outside. Provide smokers with large, deep, sturdy ashtrays. Wet cigarette butts and ashes before throwing them out or bury them in sand. Never smoke in bed. Never smoke if oxygen is used in the home.

2 Give space heaters space. Keep them at least 3 feet (1 meter) away from anything that can burn-including you.

Shut off heaters when you leave or go to bed.

Stay in the kitchen when frying food.

Never leave cooking unattended. Wear tight-fitting or short sleeves when cooking. Use oven mitts to handle hot pans. If a pan of food catches fire, slide a lid over it and turn off the burner. Don't cook if you are drowsy from alcohol or medication.

Stop, drop, and roll. If your clothes catch on fire stop (don't run), drop gently to the ground, and cover your face with your hands. Roll over and over or back and forth to put out the fire. Use cool water for 3-5 minutes to cool the burn. Get medical help right away.

Smoke alarms save lives. Have smoke alarms installed on every level of your home, inside each bedroom, and outside each sleeping area. For the best protection, use interconnected alarms so when one sounds, they all sound. Make sure everyone in your home can hear the smoke alarms. Test the alarms monthly.

6 Plan and practice your escape from fire and smoke. If possible, plan two ways out of every room in your home and two ways out of your home. Make sure windows and doors open easily. If the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside.

Your emergency number may be 9-1-1 or the fire department's phone number. Once you have escaped a fire, call the fire department from a neighbor's phone or a cell phone.

Plan your escape around your abilities. Have a telephone near your bed in case you are trapped by smoke or fire. Have other necessary items near your bed, such as medications, glasses, wheel chair, walker, scooter, or cane.

How to Prevent Falls

Exercise regularly to build strength and improve your balance and coordination. Ask your doctor about the best physical exercise for you.

2 | Take your time. Get out of chairs slowly. Sit a moment before you get out of your bed. Stand and get your balance before you walk. Be aware of your surroundings.

B Keep stairs and walking areas free of electrical cords, shoes, clothing, books, magazines, and other items.

Improve the lighting in and outside your home. Use nightlights or a flashlight to light the path between your bedroom and the bathroom. Turn on the lights before using the stairs. See an eye specialist once a year—better vision can help prevent falls.

Use non-slip mats in the bathtub and on shower floors. Have grab bars installed on the wall next to the bathtub, shower, and toilet. Wipe up spilled liquids immediately.

Be aware of uneven surfaces indoors and outdoors. Use only throw rugs that have rubber, non-skid backing. Consider non-skid rug pads under rugs. Always smooth out wrinkles and folds in carpeting. Be aware of uneven sidewalks and pavement outdoors. Ask a family member or friend to clear ice and snow from outside stairs and walkways and always use hand rails if available. Step carefully.

Stairways should be well lit from both the top and the bottom. Have easy-to-grip handrails installed along the full length of both sides of the stairs.

Wear sturdy, well-fitting, low-heeled shoes with non-slip soles. They are safer than high heels, thick-soled athletic shoes, slippers, or stocking feet.

This course is Citizen First Responder

for Healthcare Providers.

Single-rescuer CPR consisting of Highquality chest compressions, Effective
ventilations with a pocket mask
Importance of early AED use
Relief of airway obstruction in responsive
and non-responsive victims.

Cost: \$35 for town residents. This gets you a CPR card valid for 2 years.

Family & Friends CPR/AED

The Family & Friends CPR Course teaches the lifesaving skills of adult Hands-Only CPR, adult CPR with breaths, child CPR with breaths, adult and child AED use, infant CPR, and mild and severe airway block for adults, children, and infants. Skills are taught in a dynamic group environment using the AHA's research-proven practice-while-watching technique, which provides students with the most hands-on CPR practice time possible.





HINCHEY HISTORY DAY



To honor the contributions of this pioneer family and to recognize the legacy of William Steele Hinchey, the Town of Gates, Gates Town Historian William Gillette and the Gates Historical Society will sponsor "Hinchey History Day in Gates" on Sunday, June 25, 2023, from 4:00-8:00pm at the Hinchey Homestead, 634 Hinchey Road.

The commemoration will include the release of the new book Hinchey: A Pioneer Family's Legacy in the Town of Gates written by John Robortella, past editor of the Gates-Chili News, and sponsored by Mr. Gillette and the Gates Historical Society. The book chronicles the history of the Hinchey family from the arrival of William circa 1810 to the lives of his descendants. The sale of the book, and other local history publications offered by the Gates Historical Society, will be available. In addition, the afternoon will feature performances by the Gates Keystone Club Police Pipes & Drums, and The John Paulsen Trio, and will offer visitors an opportunity to tour the 1870-era Hinchey Homestead.

Through a collaborative agreement, the Gates Historical Society operates the homestead, which is owned by the Town of Gates, as a historic site and passive park. With modifications only for electricity and water service, the homestead remains virtually untouched since the pioneer days. The interior has never been remodeled. Visitors can see the intricate woodworking details which were highlights of the craftsmanship of the day. All the rooms are just as they were in the days of Franklin Hinchey and his family, including the hand-operated water pump in the kitchen, the indoor two-seater privy and the attic cistern which provided an early version of running water.

Chapters in the new Hinchey book include a history of the "Gates side" of the family and descendants to the present day. In 1855, William and most of the children moved to Michigan during the western period of national migration. Franklin remained in Gates, and it is this "side" of the family which is featured in the book.

The book also includes for the first time a complete transcription of the diary of Franklin's first wife Elizabeth Booth Hinchey (1833–1870) in which she wrote about family and farm life, services and sermons at the Gates Presbyterian Church, and national events which touched the Town of Gates such as the traverse of the Lincoln funeral train on April 14, 1865, which she and family witnessed at the Howard Road railroad crossing. Elizabeth's diary also include her recipes and her reading list, all of which are printed in the book.

The book includes a chapter on dozens of letters written to the Hinchey family from Gates soldiers who were serving in the Civil War, and the family tree of Franklin's second wife Ellen Lytle of Chili, N.Y., which extends to several of her 42nd great grandfathers and grandmothers and to King Henry I of England and to his father William "The Conqueror" King of England.



Hope Hall School Expands Footprint and Programming to better meet the Needs of Students Who Learn Differently

Hope Hall School, 1612 Buffalo Road, is a private, not-for profit, non-sectarian school serving students in grades 3-12 who learn differently. Students come from 17 school districts and 3 counties and face a variety of barriers to learning including ADD/ADHD, mild anxiety disorders, Central Auditory Processing Delays, a low-average IQ, and/or forms of Autism. In addition, 87% of students and their families face significant economic challenges. Despite these difficulties, Hope Hall has a consistent 100% graduation rate, compared to a 48% graduation rate in the City of Rochester and a 67% graduation rate in Monroe County for a similar student population.

We are thrilled to announce that the school broke ground on an exciting expansion and renovation project in mid-February. Cosmo Giunta, Gates Town Supervisor, representatives from Taylor, The builders, the General Contractor, and Passero Associates, the architectural firm, along with lead donors, members of the Board of Trustees, and others, donned hard hats and wielded golden shovels to officially mark the start of this exciting initiative.

This project is made possible by generous donor support to the *Hope for* Tomorrow *Campaign*, a 4 year, 18 million dollar comprehensive campaign that funds an expansion and renovation project, as well as enhanced student programs and services, and continued funding for ongoing educational programs, and scholarships and financial aid.

The project includes a brand new science lab, an expanded woodworking center and music room, both more than double their current size, and a new social emotional learning classroom, along with necessary repairs and renovations that come with having a building that is 80 plus years old. The expansions will allow for enhanced student programming too!

The Campaign, now in its fourth year, is over 80% to goal, having raised more than 14.9 million dollars at the time this publication went to press. Through the end of the school year, every dollar raised goes to the *Hope for* Tomorrow *Campaign* to help ensure Hope Hall meets their 18 million dollar goal.
