Good news! Punxsutawney Phil did NOT see his shadow so according to him, we will have an early spring. Let's hope he is right, which will allow us to get an early start on our Public Works projects scheduled for this year.



Speaking of spring, did you know that on April 8, 2024 there will be a Total Solar Eclipse? The exciting part is that Rochester is the largest city in the direct path of totality. They are estimating three (3) minute and thirty eight (38) second of total darkness here in our area. This is going to be huge event with an expected amount of tourist and visitors to our Rochester area. They are estimating about 300,000-500,000 visitors in our towns. Many of the surrounding hotels are already completely booked.

With that said, our town is holding a special event on April 8, 2024 called the "Great Gates Eclipse 2024". Visit page 20 for more details or contact our Recreation Department or Library for more information. We will also have a limited supply of eclipse glasses on hand. Please reach out to us to see where you can pick up a set.

I wanted to also inform you about some County paving and sidewalk projects that are scheduled in our town this year. They are looking to mill and pave two sections of town: Long Pond Road from (Lyell Rd to Gates Greece Town Line Rd) and Manitou Road from (Les Harrison Dr. [Tech Park] to Lyell Rd). In addition, new sidewalk will be installed on the east side of Elmgrove Road between Lyell Rd and Spencerport Road.

Just a few months ago, the Fire Department and Highway Department responded to a flooding call for a neighborhood having issues with water entering basements. After investigating the cause, it turned out that it was due to brush blocking the storm drains.

Friendly Brush Pickup Reminders

- The Town does not pick up furniture, electronics, grass clippings or construction materials.
- Please be sure to put your brush pile on the grass portion near the road instead of directly in the gutter.
- Brush collection will continue all year until leaf collection starts in the Fall.

DID YOU KNOW?

Current Market Statistics as reported from GRAR regarding the Town of Gates Real Estate market.

The three year period from December 2020 to December 2023 the Town of Gates single family homes saw an increase of the Median Sale price from an average of \$150,400 to \$205,000, that is an increase of 36.31% or an increase of 12.10% annually. The Greater Rochester Association of Realtors (GRAR) also noted that the average annual increase was 4.77% for the rest of the Country over the same time period. GRAR also reported that the median days on the market for single family homes was 6 days in 12/2020 and 7 days in 12/2023, virtually no difference. The number of closed sales remained steady at near the 30 mark. According to these statistics it seems that the R.E. housing market in Gates has gone up consistently over the last 3 years and is expected to stay on this path during most of 2024. Market analysts are hoping that the recent slight decrease in mortgage interest rates will continue in 2024 hopefully easing these trends a bit by the 4th quarter.



The Assessor's Office is also responsible for administering any exemption(s), where eligibility is met. We offer Limited Income Senior, Limited Income Disability, Veterans, Enhanced STAR, and Volunteer Fire/Ambulance Workers exemptions. These applications are available in our office and on the Town website. It is important to note that all exemptions must be received by March 1st-with no exceptions.

Over the past few months the Gates Police Department has had many changes. We promoted a new Road Patrol Lieutenant and filled a previously vacant Captain's position. Sergeant Christopher Grimm was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in January 2024 and took over as the Road Patrol Commander. At the February 2024 town board meeting, we promoted Lieutenant Matthew Pascarella to the rank of Captain. Captain Pascarella and Lieutenant Grimm have both held supervisory roles within our department for over 10 years.

June 8, 10:00am-12:00pm – Bike Safety and Rodeo – Parents and Children


The Gates Police Department Bike Patrol Unit will conduct a safety presentation for all of those interested in the safe operation of a bicycle. The class will provide general bicycle riding knowledge, information on the rule of the road and much more. An equipment inspection to make sure you're ready to go will be conducted. A bicycle operation course will also be available to test out your new skills.

Sign up for these classes can be done through the Gates Recreation and Parks. All Gates Residents may attend free of charge (preregistration is still required). A \$10 non resident fee is assessed for those whom reside outside of the Town of Gates.









100th Anniversary 1924-2024

The possibility of a parish was first proposed on April 16, 1923. The people of North Gates came together to ask for a parish for their growing community. Most of the Catholic families here were either members of Holy Apostles or Holy Family Parishes. These were both located several miles away. Distance and means of transportation became the most important obstacle a Catholic family had to overcome in order to fulfill the obligations of their faith.

The Catholics of North Gates persevered and on May 14, 1924, more than a year after being proposed, the Canonical approved the request for the construction of the new, but yet unnamed parish. It was formally announced on July 1, 1924, but still only on paper.

Where would the Masses be celebrated? The large farmhouse of the Michael Kenney Family was suggested. This home was farther west at the intersection of Lyell and Howard Roads.

The next two weeks passed quickly as the Kenney Home was transformed into the parishes first place of worship. It was at this first Mass that Father Baier, the first Pastor, would announce the new parish name.

When word had spread through North Gates that Mass was going to be said at the Kenney home, people arrived in such large numbers that the plans had to be changed from an "Indoor Mass" to an "Outdoor Mass".

By January 26, 1925, permission was received to buy four acres offered by the Kenney family on Spencerport Road for \$4,000. The deed was recorded March 24, 1925.

It was hard to believe that a year had passed since the Kenney's offered their home as a church. Now it was May 10, 1925 and they were breaking ground for a Church and School at a cost of \$20,665.75. At 4:30 pm on Sunday, July 12, 1925 the cornerstone was laid into place. The school opened on September 8, 1925 with an enrollment of 64 pupils.

The Depression hit and things quietly moved along, but soon after Gates started growing again...and quickly. Father John Baier was assigned to another parish in 1937. Father Raymond Epping became pastor and served the parish until his retirement in 1960. Father Elmer Heindl was assigned for one year, then Monsignor Dennis Hickey was named pastor in 1961 and served until 1968, when he was appointed auxiliary Bishop. In 1966, the rapid suburban growth had reached a high again and an expansion of the church and school took place.

Coming to St. Theodore's as a new pastor was Father Gerald Dunn. He was instrumental in getting lay people to become involved in the work of the parish. St. Theodore's Council was organized in 1971 and was among the first in the diocese. In 1973, groundbreaking for Dunn Tower Apartments was held. Father Dunn was the force behind getting this much needed senior housing. It was built on land donated by St. Theodore's Parish. Dunn Tower II was completed in 1979.

Father Dunn retired in June of 1992 and Father Dan Holland was named pastor. The Parish thrived under Fathers Dan's leadership and pastoral guidance. In June 1994 the Diocese closed the school to make way for a central junior high, All Saints Academy.

As the 75th Anniversary of the parish came to be, so did another renovation. In January 1999, the parish celebrated the dedication of the church with former pastor, Bishop Dennis Hickey, presiding.

In 2002, Father Holland was assigned to St. Pius and Father George Okoth came to St. Theodores. He served until 2005, when he became a chaplain in the Army. Father Steve Kraus was named Pastor in 2006 and retired in June 2017. Father Frederick Asurning, who was a chaplain at Strong Memorial Hospital, was assigned as Parochial Administrator in June 2017 and was called back to Ghana in June 2021. Father Kevin McKenna was assigned Pastor in June 2021, and is currently leading our parish. He was able to provide us with the support needed during the Covid epidemic and encouraged us to stay strong in our faith through this very difficult time.

One hundred years ago, the families of the North Gates community came together to establish a place to honor and worship God. During this year, help us to gratefully remember the beginning, respect what wonderful things they accomplished, and to work hard to strengthen our faith community for future generations to follow.

60th anniversary 1964-2024

The Gates Volunteer Ambulance Service (GVAS) marked six decades of operations on February 23, 2024, which was the 60th anniversary of the first official meeting of the Board of Directors at which Gates Police Chief William Stauber was elected president; John F. Montione, M.D., was elected vice president; and Gerald Schifino was elected secretary. John DeGroot was appointed as the first director of operations. Anthony Federico was appointed as the first director of training.

Within a month of the meeting, the first formal fund drive began under the leadership of Robert Lechner of Hinchey Road.

Thirty volunteers then joined and began their first aid training. By September 1964, the board took delivery of a new ambulance at a cost of \$10,195 and the first emergency call to which GVAS responded came in at 5:15 p.m. on November 2, 1964. It was an auto accident on Chili Avenue; victims were taken to St. Mary's Hospital in Rochester. A few days later, on Sunday, November 8, 1964, a public open house was held at the first formal GVAS headquarters in the renovated Gulf Service Station on the northeast corner of the Buffalo Road/Howard Road intersection.


The first maternity call was received at 5:20 a.m. on Monday, March 22, 1965. Volunteers David George and Robert Ruemelin responded to the home of Ann German and her family on Laurel Avenue and delivered Ann's second child, daughter Ellen, at the house.

On Saturday, June 18, 1966, the GVAS headquarters were relocated to a new building at 144 Gatewood Avenue. In March 1977, a new base of operations was opened at 1600 Buffalo Road; and on July 8, 2011, the ribbon was cut for the opening of the present headquarters at 1004 Elmgrove Road. In March 2014, GVAS and the Spencerport Volunteer Ambulance Service merged to consolidate emergency medical service operations in both communities.

Today, more than 100 volunteer and career members operate a fleet of 12 vehicles and one UTV from three stations and cover a district of more than 52 square miles. In 2023, GVAS responded to more than 9,900 calls for service, with most of the responses requiring Advanced Life Support. In addition, GVAS hosts weekly blood pressure checks and monthly CPR, AED and Stop the Bleed training for the community, along with other advanced classes for health care providers.







50th anniversary 1974-2024








George Savastano is the founder of Savastano's Bakery & Pizzeria, a family owned and operated bakery, pizzeria, Italian market and catering business proudly serving the Rochester area since 1974. Located at 477 Spencerport Road in the Town of Gates, this beloved bakery is well-known for their delicious pizzas, hot and cold subs and variety of homemade Easter breads, and is home to the "original Mini Pizzas and Stuffed Breads." Even after 50 years, you'll often find George in the back of the bakery with a big smile on his face and flour on his hands.

George discovered his love for baking while serving in the United States Army. After completing his military service in November, 1965, he came home and worked with Gruttadauria's Bakery where his interest in baking turned into a passion. In the late 60s, after a few years of long hours, back-breaking work and a strong work ethic, George was able to make his dream come true and open his own bakery at 25 Jay Street. He operated his bakery while still working for Gruttadauria's next door. When Helen and Sam Gaglio, the owners of Gruttadauria's, returned from a visit to Italy raving about the small pizzas they had enjoyed there, George decided to create his own version and the Savastano's mini-pizza was born! In 1974, George moved Savastano's Bakery from Jay Street to Spencerport Road. The family baking business has been going strong ever since.

Savastano's Bakery is proudly celebrating their Golden Anniversary in 2024. After 50 years in business, they still use traditional Italian family recipes that have been passed down for generations. When Savastano's first opened, it was operated by George, his wife, Linda, his parents, Francis & Tom Savastano, and his mother- and father-in-law, Connie & Phil DeSino. As the business grew, so did the amount of family that worked there. Over the years all four of his children, George, Philip, Tommy & Gina have worked there and when you go in today, you'll still find brothers- and sister in-laws, nieces, nephews, cousins and now grandchildren working in both the front and back of the bakery. Making bread and pizza has never been more of a family affair than it is at Savastano's.

George still comes in everyday to make his special homemade cookies, but has happily passed other responsibilities on to his family. His son, George is now the lead baker. His daughter, Gina is the operations manager and his granddaughter, Alexis, the business manager. Savastano's is a family business through and through - it's how the business began in 1974 and it's how it's still being run. They do it for the love of baking and they do it for their customers who are their neighbors and friends as well.

George says that, "Baking is one of the ways we show love, and it's also our way of thanking the community. Everyone has helped us make wonderful memories with Savastano's Bakery. 




